The Recycling Center is closed Christmas Eve and Christmas Day

What holiday items can be recycled at the Bryan Drive-In Recycling Center?

ITEM	Recyclable in Bryan?	NOTES
Greeting Cards & Envelopes	Yes	Reuse cards in scrapbooks and crafts
Catalogs	Yes	Receiving unwanted catalogs? Ask companies to take you off their lists
Ribbons & Bows	No	Reuse on other gift packages throughout the year
Gift Bags	No	Reuse to package other gifts throughout the year
Gift Boxes	No	Reuse to package other gifts throughout the year
Corrugated Cardboard	Yes	Be sure to flatten and remove any inner packaging
Gift Wrap & Cardboard Tubes	No	Get creative! Use alternative wrapping paper such as the Sunday comics
Tissue Paper	No	Reuse to package other gifts throughout the year
Rechargeable Batteries	Yes	Be sure to buy rechargeable batteries year round
TVs and Computers	No	Recycle them at the BSWMA Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection on April 25 th , 2009
Cell Phones and Cell Phone Batteries	Yes	No cell phone accessories accepted (chargers, adaptors, headsets, etc.)
Disposable Dinnerware	No	Use reusable plates, cups and cutlery
Wine and Champagne Bottles	Yes	No blue or green glass accepted

I tend to cook a lot over the holidays. Where can I recycle my used cooking grease?

Used cooking grease may be recycled The City of Bryan Used Oil Drop-off Center. This center offers Bryan residents free used motor oil, filter and cooking grease recycling at: 1111 Waco Street Next to our Municipal Service Center, off of Martin Luther King Blvd. Please, no commercial customers.

How can I recycle my Christmas tree after the holidays?

Fake trees, with no missing parts, should be donated to a local thrift store such as Goodwill, Hospice or the Salvation Army.

Live trees may be recycled placing your tree curbside for the City's brush collection on the normal yard waste collection days for duplexes, four-plex, and single family dwellings.

Live trees may also be recycled at the Bryan/College Station annual Christmas Tree Recycling Event at Sue Haswell Park (stay tuned for details).

All collected trees will be brought to the City of Bryan Compost Facility and made into compost.
